VELOMONT TRAIL COLLECTIVE

In 2022 a Joint Venture was formed between Vermont Huts Association and Velomont Trail Collective (VTC) to catalyze the construction of the country's largest hut supported trail network, linking existing networks, connecting communities, and bolstering local economies. In 2022 VTC hired a full time Executive Director and, together, the organizations brought on two Project Coordinators.

Environmental stewardship is a critical piece of VHA and VTC's strategic vision. The Trust for Public Land, one of our nonprofit partners, has identified 214,000 acres of unprotected land within the Velomont Trail and Vermont Huts corridor between Canada and Massachusetts, presenting an opportunity for recreation to catalyze conservation on a statewide level.

Both VHA and VTC have been engaging private landowners in conversations about ways in which they can be a part of conserving their surrounding resources, protecting the Velomont Trail and Vermont Huts network in perpetuity. This will not only guarantee public access to the network for generations to come, but also play a key role in protecting the valuable climate resilience corridor for species migration as temperatures rise.

Conserving as much land as possible at the outset of our project can help to slow forest fragmentation and protect large tracts of remote land from future subdivision and development where it could have negative environmental impacts.

FOREST Program

VHA's FOREST (Fostering Outdoor Recreation, Education, Sustainability, and Teamwork) Program provides a new point of access to the outdoors for underrepresented individuals. The program partners with organizations around the state to offer twoday, two-night guided adventures completely free of charge.

Each trip is complete with equipment, team-building/problem solving exercises, natural history workshops, overview of the surrounding ecosystem, and an opportunity to explore the surrounding trail network. This is a year-round program that grows exponentially as we expand our network and comes at no cost to participants.



Completed in November 2022, Grout Pond Hut is Vermont Huts Association's second owned and operated hut in the network. Located in the Green Mountain National Forest near the towns of Stratton and Dover, Grout Pond Hut offers ample yearround recreation opportunities and officially opened to the public in January of 2023!

FUNDRAISING

• In 2022, Vermont Huts secured \$3.8 million in Congressionally Directed Spending to support the construction of 10 huts and 5 hostels throughout the state of Vermont. Highly restricted and requiring matching funds, this earmark makes it even more important for VHA to raise unrestricted funding in 2023 and to unlock these federal dollars.
